### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish clear guidelines regarding appropriate attire for all staff members to maintain a professional and respectful environment that reflects the values and standards of the school.

# 2. Scope

This policy applies to all staff members, including teaching and administrative personnel, while on school premises or during school-related events.

#### 4. Responsibilities

- All staff members are responsible for adhering to the dress code and maintaining a professional appearance.
- School leadership is responsible for enforcing the dress code and making final determinations on appropriate attire.

# 5. Policy Coverage

#### A. Clothing Requirements

- Staff members must not wear clothing with large logos, excessive wear, fading, rips, or tears.
- Tattoos must not be visible during school hours.
- Prohibited attire includes shorts (except for PE staff), combat pants, and cargo pants.
- Jewelry should be discreet and professional.
- Visible body piercings, aside from small earrings, are discouraged.





#### **B. Male Staff Dress Code**

- Male staff must wear smart business casual attire, including button-down shirts paired with trousers or chinos. Shorts, cargo or combat pants are not permitted. Clean, pressed formal or dress shirts are required daily.
- Formal shoes are required—no sandals, flip-flops, casual trainers, or slippers.
- Jackets or blazers are mandatory for parents' evenings and school events.

#### C. Female Staff Dress Code

- Female staff must wear smart attire, including blazers or jackets with trousers (skirts must be below the knee).
- T-shirts are not permitted.
- Clean formal or smart open shoes are acceptable.
- Dresses and blouses should adhere to modesty standards, covering the knee when sitting, standing, or bending.

#### D. Physical Education (PE) Staff

- PE staff are required to wear provided polo shirts and shorts.
- After-School Sports Club teachers should wear professional dress and may change after school if necessary.

#### E. Professional Conduct Reminders

- Staff members are role models for students and should maintain a professional and business-like appearance at all times.
- Be mindful of diverse backgrounds when interacting with parents.
- High standards of personal hygiene and grooming are expected to minimize discomfort caused by the climate.
- ID cards must be worn during school hours for security and safety purposes.





#### F. General Guidelines

- All employees are expected to exercise good taste and conservatism in their dress.
- Faculty should not wear tight-fitting or revealing clothes, flip-flops, beach sandals, sports sandals, athletic shoes, denim/jean material of any color, cargo pants, leggings (instead of trousers), or T-shirts.
- Advanced approval is required for faculty wishing to wear blue jeans, outfits made of denim, shorts, or T-shirts for any special outing or occasion.
- Smart-looking shorts and polo shirts are acceptable only for PE department personnel.

# **G. Thursday Dress Code**

- Every Thursday, staff members are required to wear the school polo shirt (will be provided to everyone soon).
- Jeans are permitted on Thursdays only, provided they are dark blue, black, neat, free of rips, tears, or fading. No skinny jeans will be allowed.
